She joined Nikolai for a cosy trip to Italy last month, including an intimate dinner at Ristorante da Ivo - a celeb fave where George Clooney held his stag party.

"The young man wants to marry her in Venice at a little church they love, San Nicolò dei Mendicoli, which was in the
